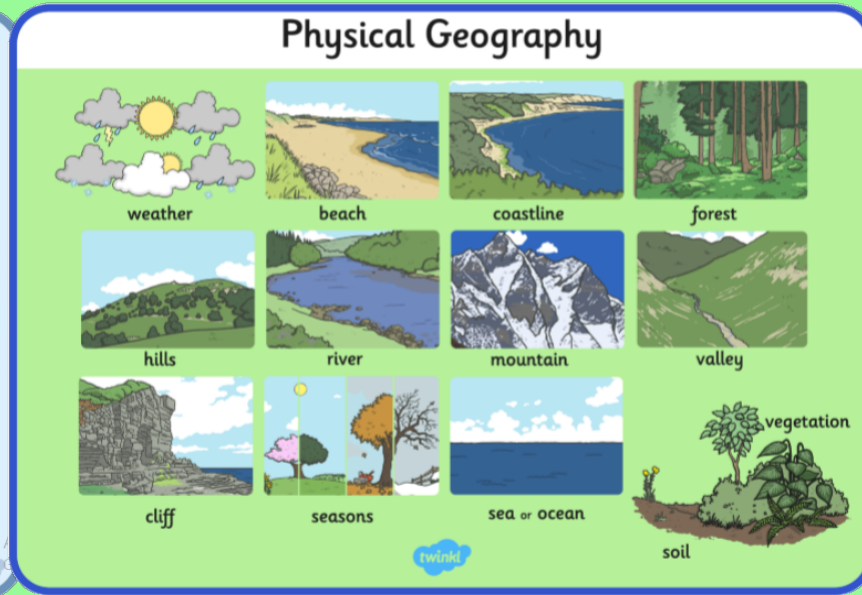
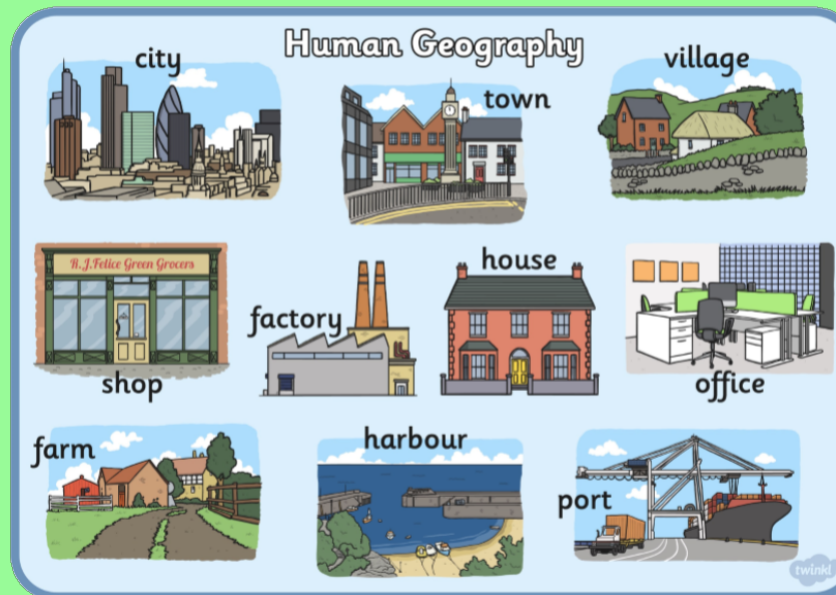

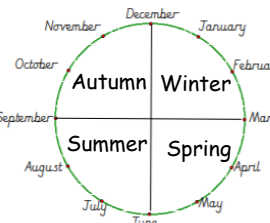
LQ: What are the differences between the seasonal weather patterns in Herne Bay and Teshie?

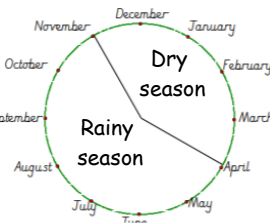

UK Seasons



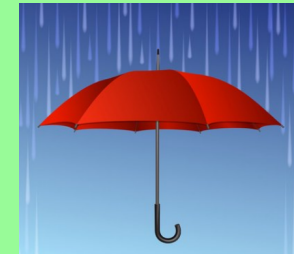
