

## **Year 1 Writing**



By the end of Year 1, most children should be able to:

- Use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops correctly to write short sentences.
- Write a sequence of sentences (at least 3) to form short narratives.
- ❖ Use conjunctions to extend sentences e.g. and, but, because.
- Use exclamation marks and question marks where appropriate.
- Use capital letters for names of people, places, the days of the week and the personal pronoun 'l'.
- Use adjectives to describe a noun e.g. big dog; yellow sun; soft toy.
- ❖ Understand verbs as doing words e.g. playing, jumping.
- Spell many Year 1 common exception words correctly and apply phonic knowledge and spelling rules to attempt to spell other words.
- Understand and use singular and plural nouns e.g. dog dogs; chair chairs; wish wishes; dress dresses.
- ❖ Form all letters of the alphabet, and digits 0-9, in cursive handwriting. Children should be encouraged to join letters and remember to cross the t's and dot the i's!
- Read aloud their own writing and discuss what they have read to check that it makes sense.
