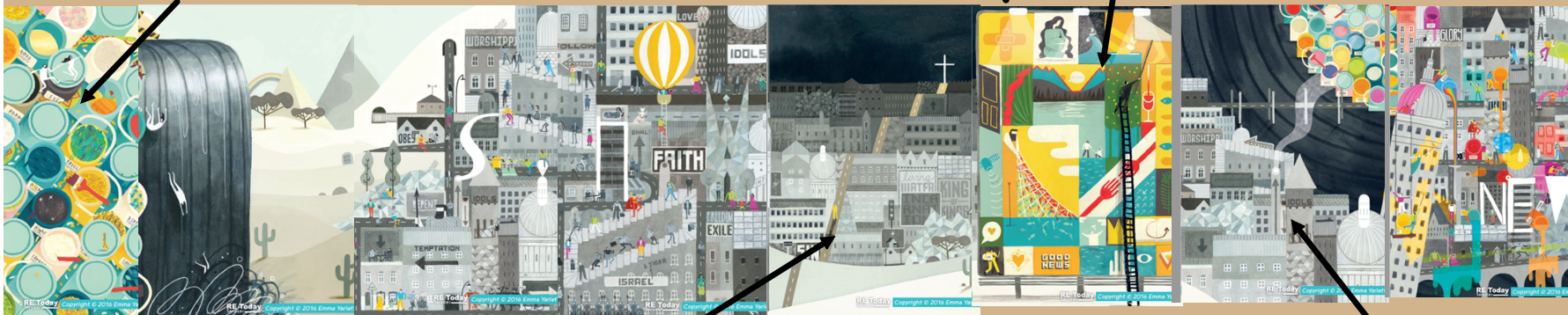

The Easter story is one of sadness followed by great happiness.



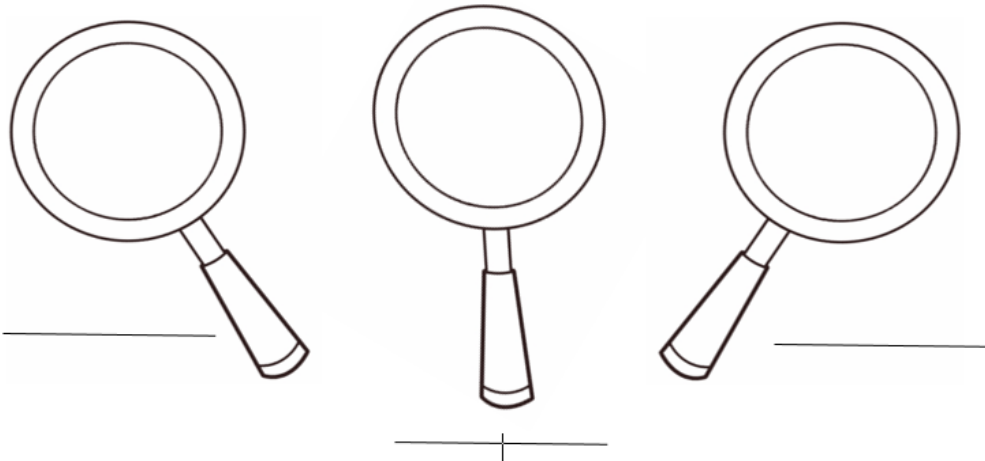
