

What are homophones?

Homophones are words that sound the same but have different meanings.

Some homophones are pronounced the same way and spelt the same way but have different meanings, for example:

rose (the flower) and rose (past tense of the verb to rise)

Some homophones are pronounced the same way but are spelled differently and have different meanings. For example:


wait (the verb) and weight (how heavy something is)


