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Story

New Living Translation

Jesus appeared again to the disciples beside the Sea of Galilee. This is how it happened. Several of the disciples were there - Simon Peter, Thomas (nicknamed the Twin), Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two other disciples. Simon Peter said, "I'm going fishing." "We'll come, too," they all said. So they went out in the boat, but they caught nothing all night. At dawn Jesus was standing on the beach, but the disciples couldn't see who he was. He called out, "Fellows, have you caught any fish?"

"No," they replied. Then he said, "Throw out your net on the right-hand side of the boat, and you'll get some!" So they did, and they couldn't haul in the net because there were so many fish in it. Then the disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, "It's the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his tunic (for he had stripped for work), jumped into the water, and headed to shore. The others stayed with the boat and pulled the loaded net to the shore, for they were only about a hundred yards from shore. When they got there, they found breakfast waiting for them - fish cooking over a charcoal fire, and some bread. "Bring some of the fish you've just caught," Jesus said. So Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore. There were 153 large fish, and yet the net hadn't torn. "Now come and have some breakfast!" Jesus said. None of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. Then Jesus served them the bread and the fish. This was the third time Jesus had appeared to his disciples since he had been raised from the dead.

After breakfast Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," Peter replied, "you know I love you." "Then feed my lambs," Jesus told him.

Jesus repeated the question: "Simon son of John, do you love me?" "Yes, Lord," Peter said, "you know I love you." "Then take care of my sheep," Jesus said.

A third time he asked him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt that Jesus asked the question a third time. He said, "Lord, you know everything. You know that I love you." Jesus said, "Then feed my sheep."

4. Why do you think Jesus asked Peter three times if he loved him?
5. How do you think Peter felt after having this conversation with Jesus?

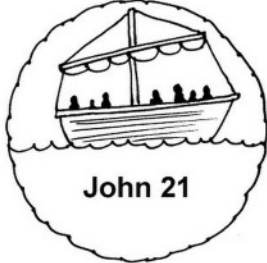

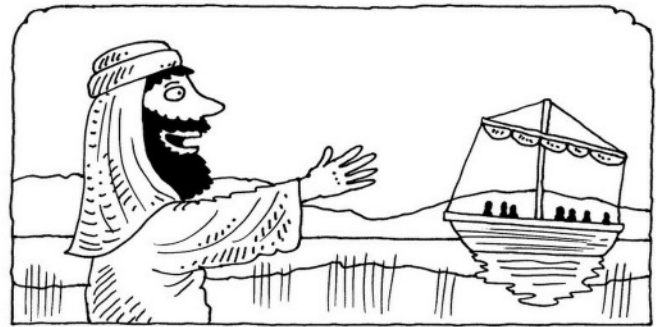
Jesus disciples were sad and they missed Jesus even though they had heard about people seeing Jesus alive again, risen from the dead!



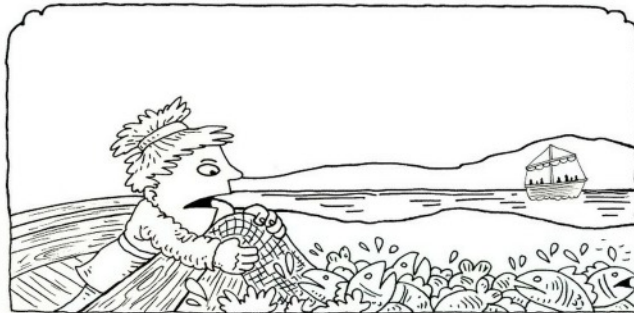

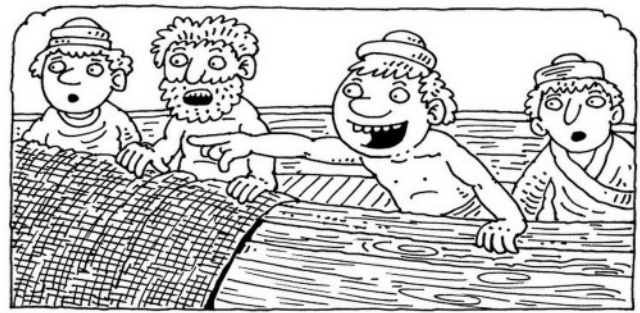
Twice since Jesus had died on the cross people had said that they had seen him alive. "Could that be true?" they wondered. They didn't even catch one fish all that night.



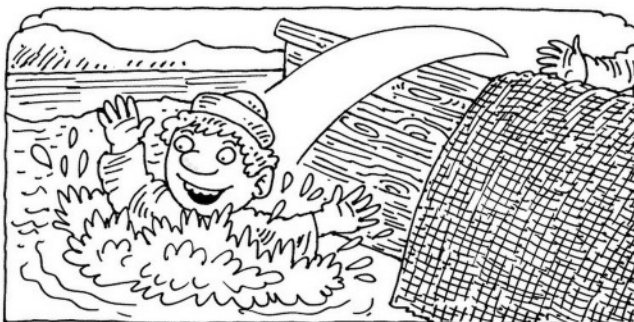
Next morning Jesus stood on the shore, but his disciples didn't know it was him. Jesus called out, "Did you catch anything?" "No," they answered.

How about going on a family picnic by the sea, a river or lake? You could have fish finger sandwiches and tell the story.



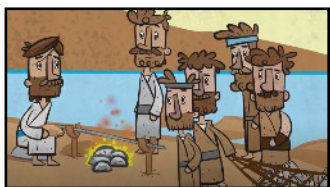
Creating a pretend fire

Craft

Fishing Game

You will need:

Empty food box
A4 white card,
bamboo skewer, paper clips,
thread or wool, paint brush,
blue & green paint,
tissue paper, felt pens,
Sellotape, holepunch,
scissors.



1. To make the fish tank gently open up empty food box & cut off 'lid'.



2. Sellotape corners to secure box to make the fish tank.



3. Paint the fish tank in blue & green paint & let dry.



4. To make seagrass, cut long strips of tissue paper – blue or green would look good!



5. Fold tissue paper strips in half & Sellotape.



6. Make some more seagrass.



7. Sellotape the seagrass onto the fish tank.



8. On A4 white card, design some sea creatures! Colour in.



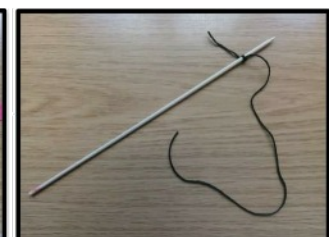
9. Cut out sea creatures & colour in other side to match your designs.



10. Use a holepunch to make a hole in each sea creature.



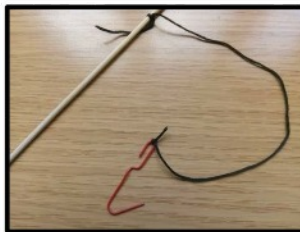
11. Attach a paper clip through every hole.



12. To make the fishing rod, tie a piece of thread or wool to the bamboo skewer.



13. To make the fishing hook, carefully open up a paper clip like in the picture.



14. Tie the hook tightly to the end of the thread.



15. Put your sea creatures into the fish tank & have fun trying to catch them all with your fishing rod!



Creative prayer

Prayer boat

You will need:

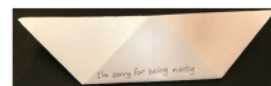
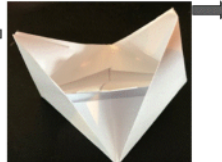
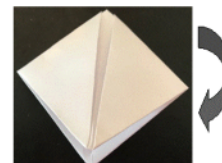
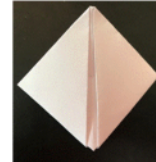
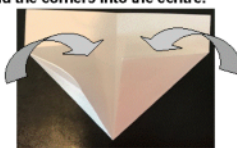
- A4 size piece of paper
- Something to write
- An ADULT from your family to take you to a small stream or river

What to do:

- Follow the instructions to make the paper boat.
- Think of something you want to say 'sorry' for and write it on the side of the boat.
- Ask an adult member of your family to accompany you to a small stream or river.
- Put the boat on the water and as the boat moves away, say 'thank you' to God for forgiving you.



1. Fold a piece of A4 paper in half, then fold the corners into the centre.
2. Fold down the flaps in the front and back.
3. Open out the square shape and fold the other way.
4. Fold the 2 flaps down and outwards on both sides.
5. Open out the shape and fold the other way.
6. Turn it around.
7. Pull out the corner points on each side.
8. Fold the boat shape flat. Write your prayer on the side.



Move the fish to the bowl

You will need:

- A straw for each player
- Fish made from paper
- Bowl
- Timer

How to play:

- Place the paper fish on the table and place the bowl a short distance away.
- Each player takes a turn to move all the fish into the bowl by sucking them up using the straw.
- Who can do this fastest on their turn?



Obstacle course 3

You will need:

- 3 obstacles like those pictured
- Timer - like a watch or phone

How to play:

- Place the three obstacles in a row inside or outside.
- Each player is to follow the obstacle course three times.
- Time each player!
- The winner is the one who finishes the course three times in the fastest time.
