New Living Translation

One day as we were going down to the place of prayer, we met a slave girl who had a spirit that enabled her to tell the future. She earned a lot of money for her masters by telling fortunes. She followed Paul and the rest of us, shouting, "These men are servants of the Most High God, and they have come to tell you how to be saved." This went on day after day until Paul got so exasperated that he turned and said to the



demon within her, "I command you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And instantly it left her. Her masters' hopes of wealth were now shattered, so they grabbed Paul and Silas and dragged them before the authorities at the marketplace. "The whole city is in an uproar because of these Jews!" they shouted to the city officials. "They are teaching customs that are illegal for us Romans to practice." A mob quickly formed against Paul and Silas, and the city officials ordered them stripped and beaten with wooden rods. They were severely beaten, and then they were thrown into prison. The jailer was ordered to make sure they didn't escape. So the jailer put them into the inner dungeon and clamped their feet in the stocks. Around midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening. Suddenly, there was a massive earthquake, and the prison was shaken to its foundations. All the doors



immediately flew open, and the chains of every prisoner fell off! The jailer woke up to see the prison doors wide open. He assumed the prisoners had escaped, so he drew his sword to kill himself. But Paul shouted to him, "Stop! Don't kill yourself! We are all here!" The jailer called for lights and ran to the dungeon and fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. Then he brought them out and asked, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" They replied, "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved, along with

everyone in your household." And they shared the word of the Lord with him and with all who lived in his household. Even at that hour of the night, the jailer cared for them and washed their wounds. Then he and everyone in his household were immediately baptized. He brought them into his house and set a meal before them, and he and his entire household rejoiced because they all believed in God.

Dear God, You are so good! I praise You because You are so wonderful, so kind and perfect. Thank You for loving me. Amen.




PAUL and Silas sing in jail






Paul and Silas went from town to town telling everyone the good news about Jesus Christ the son of God.



There they told a young girl all about Jesus and she became a Christian. However, her master was very angry about it and had Paul and Silas arrested.




In jail they cheered each other up with words from the Bible and sang songs of praise to God all night. The other prisoners and guards heard them.




Their friends also prayed for them and that night an earthquake shook the prison doors open.


If the prisoners escaped the prison guards would be in trouble.

- Shake the jar until the marble / golf ball reaches the top of the rice.




A song every day



When you've finished you'll find out what Paul and Silas did.




Questions from the story

The jail

Ingredients:

- Square or rectangular crackers
- Bread sticks
- Cream cheese
- Strawberries

How to assemble your jail:

- Place one cracker on a plate and cover thickly with cream cheese
- Cut two people shapes out of strawberries and place in the centre of the cracker.
- Place the bread sticks vertically around the edge of the cracker to form the jail bars.
- Cover the second cracker with cream cheese and place on top of the breadsticks cream cheese side down to form the roof of the jail.



Prayer chain with foil

You will need: Kitchen foil

What to do:

- Cut a piece of foil and shape it to make a loop like a link in a chain.
- As you create the circle think of the name of a friend or family member, or someone in need and ask God to be near them.
- Make more than one circle or ask your family members to make a circle as well and put them together to create a chain.















































You will need:

- Recording of the beginning bars of familiar songs
- Paper and pencil / pen

How to play:


- One person plays the first bars of familiar songs for the the other to guess they write their answers on a piece of paper.
- At the end of the game players will need to swap papers and mark them.
- The winner will be the person who guessed the most correctly.

Memory game

You will need: Cards with the words of the verse (as pictured).

How to play:

- Place the words on the cards in the correct order, just as they are in the verse. Now read the verse and then turn one of the cards upside down and recite the verse again. Do this over and over until every card is turned upside down and you can recite the whole verse. If more than one is playing take it in turns to see who can remember the verse best.
- Think of Paul and Silas singing in prison and how God freed them from there.
- When you know the verse very well you can turn the cards upside down and mix the words and then try to put the words of the verse in the correct order.



Hold the bars

You will need:

- Floor brush, mop or swimming noodle for each player
- 3 or more players

How to play:

- The players stand about 1m apart each holding their floor brush/swimming noodle so that one end is on the floor.
- After counting to three, each player lets go of their floor brush/swimming noodle and moves one position to the left trying to catch the next player's brush/noodle before it falls into the floor.
- Continue until one player fails.
- How many times can you change places?
