






New Living Translation


"Where do you want us to prepare it?" they asked him.

Simple version

Jesus told them, "go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a jar of water. Follow him and ask the owner of the house to show you the guest room. Prepare the meal

As evening came it was time to have the meal so Jesus sat around the table with the disciples. Before they had the meal, Jesus washed the disciples' feet and told them "love each other and care for each other just as I love and care for you." Jesus took the loaf of bread and said, "take this bread and share it - it represents my body given for you." He then took a cup of wine and said, "take the wine and drink it - it represents my blood poured out for you."

Thank You because He came into the world and lived a life full of love. Please help me to understand how much Jesus loves me. Amen.




Jesus went to Jerusalem, for the very last time, to eat the special Passover feast with his friends.

Look for a man carrying a water jar and follow him. He will show you where to go." His friends found the man and followed him.




The man went into a house.


This was the house Jesus would come to.

Jesus friends knocked


at the door and waited.

Soon Jesus came with his other friends. They went up stairs to have dinner together.




Jesus took the flat bread and broke it.




















Prayer on a plate


You will need:

Cups of wine


How many cups of wine can you find hidden in the picture below?

Jigsaw

Cut the jigsaw into pieces.

Mix up the pieces.

How quickly can you put the jigsaw back together?



This food is part of the Jewish passover meal.

Unleavened bread (Bread without yeast)

Ingredients:

- 2 cups and 2 tablespoons of plain flour
- 1 cup of cold water
- ½ teaspoon of salt

Method:

- Mix the salt with the flour in a large bowl. Add the water and mix until a dough is formed. Then knead the dough for 5 minutes.
- Heat the frying pan by putting it on a medium heat.
- Take 7 pieces of dough and form balls. Roll out each ball into an oval (about 15cm long) on a lightly floured surface.
- Cook the dough in the warm pan for 2 minutes each side.

Charoset

Ingredients:

- 1 cup of walnuts (halves and pieces)
- 250g of dates (about 13 large ones with the stone removed from each)
- ¼ cup of orange juice
- 1 'Granny Smith' apple peeled, finely ground and crushed.
- ½ teaspoon of cinnamon
- ¼ teaspoon of ginger

Method:

- Put the walnuts in the food processor and chop finely. Then transfer the nuts to a bowl. Keep a tablespoon of the nuts to decorate the charoset.
- Now put the dates and orange juice in the food processor and process the ingredients to make a thick paste. Remember to scrape the sides of the processor bowl every now and then if necessary.
- Transfer the paste to the bowl that has the walnuts. Add the apple, cinnamon and ginger and mix throughly.
- Taste the charoset and add more orange juice, cinnamon and ginger if you want a stronger flavour.
- To decorate, sprinkle the remaining spoonful of walnuts over the top of the charoset.

If you do not have a food processor you can make the charoset by hand.

How about learning this verse by heart? "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."


