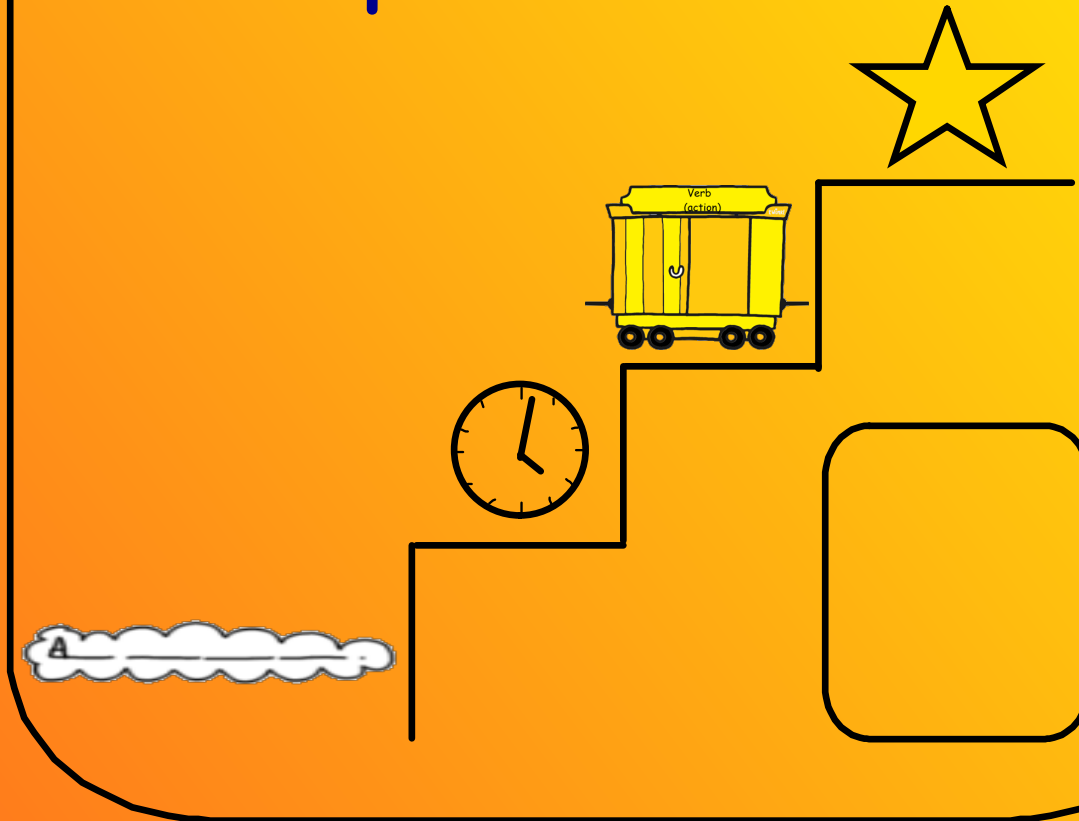

LO: To consistently write in the correct tense (past)

This week, we have been writing recount narratives of the events that happened during the Great Fire of London.



*We've been focussing on writing in **past tense**. Can you remember what the difference between **past** and **present tense** is?*

PRESENT TENSE

The present tense means that the verb (action) is happening now.

Past Tense

The past tense means that the verb (action) is has already happened. It happened in the past.

e.g.

The bakery is on fire.

The bakery was on fire.

The people are running away fast.

The people ran away fast.

People are scared.

People were scared.
