






In your writing book, or on some lined paper, have a go at writing a narrative about the events that happened during the Great Fire of London. You should have generated lots of ideas during the shared writing yesterday, so now is the time to pull all of that together in your own, independent writing.

Focus of our writing:

The focus this week is on **past tense**, so make sure your verbs are past tense verbs!









We are writing a recount narrative, so we are not making events up. We are writing about what really happened, linking sentences together so it flows into a paragraph.

A possible opener for your narrative...
