We can use adjectives when we compare two things.

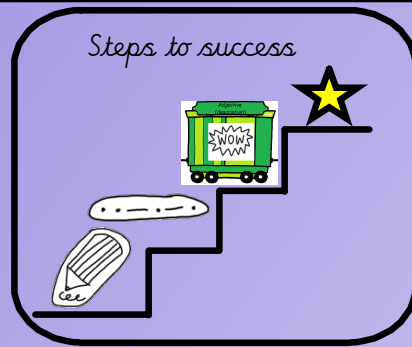


bright

LO: To add -er and -est to adjectives where the root word doesn't change.

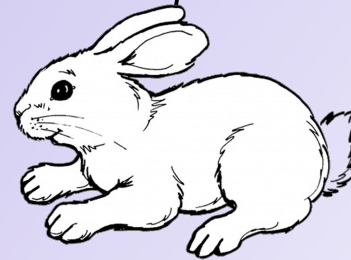
Let's look at a few more examples:

small

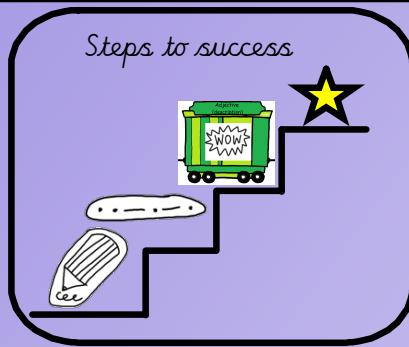

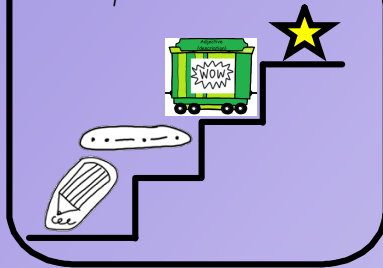




LO: To add -er and -est to adjectives where the root word doesn't change.

When we compare two things, we add the letters er to the end of the word. This is called a suffix. We are looking at adjectives where no change is needed to the root word.

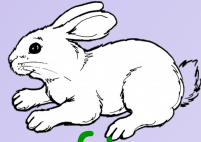
