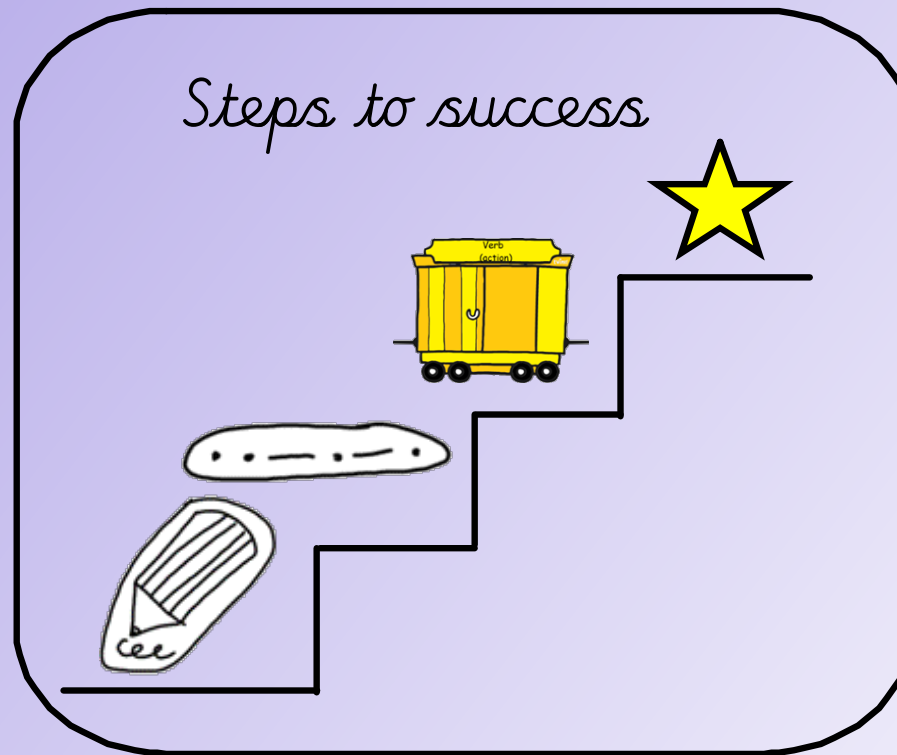
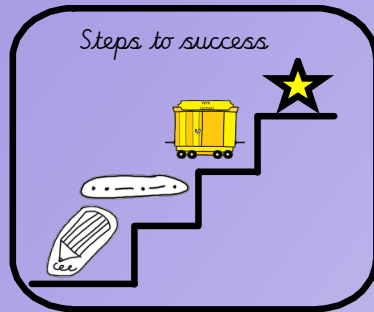

What do these symbols mean?

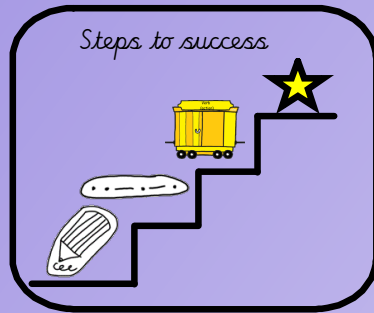


LO: To add -ing and -ed to verbs
where the root word doesn't change.

What is a verb?



A verb is a doing/action word such as jump,
draw, listen, look.



LO: To add -ing and -ed to verbs where the root word doesn't change.

What is a suffix?

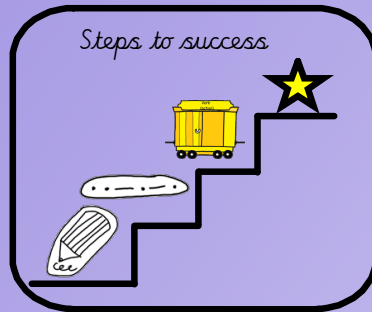
A suffix is a group of letters that can be added to the end of a root word to slightly change its meaning.

e.g. *walk* + *ed* → *walked*

walk is the root word

ed is the suffix





LO: To add -ing and -ed to verbs
where the root word doesn't change.

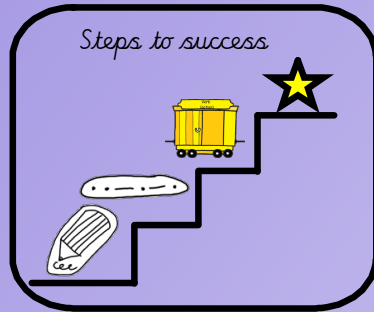
e.g. *enjoy* + *ing* → *enjoying*

enjoy is the root word

ing is the suffix



The way we use these suffixes can depend on the past and the present. For example "I am talking to you" is in the present. However, "I talked to my friend" is in the past.
