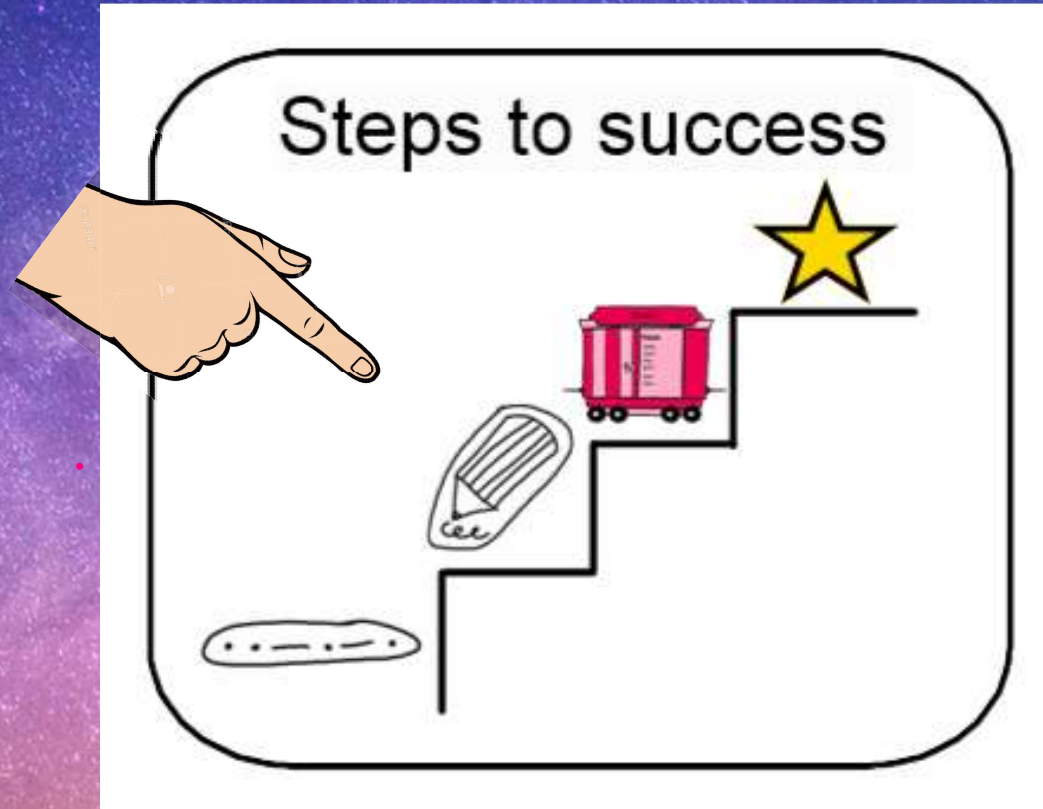

Then you had a go at finding nouns in some sentences from the book.

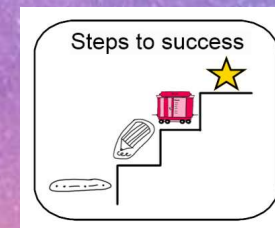
Let's see how you got on...



LO: To know how to change nouns from singular to plural by adding s or es.

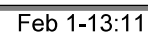
Baby Bear found a rocket in the cupboard under the stairs.

What is a plural?

one cat

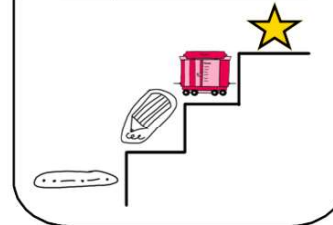


three cats



Plural means 'more than one'.

Steps to success

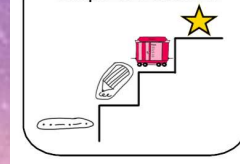


LO: To know how to change nouns from singular to plural by adding s or es.

What do you notice?

Singular = 1		Plural = more than 1
 One dog	→	Lots of dogs 
 One door	→	Lots of doors 
 One pencil	→	Lots of pencils 
 One lamp	→	Lots of lamps 

Steps to success



LO: To know how to change nouns from singular to plural by adding s or es.

If the word ends with a long s sound or a hiss sound like...

sh

ch

ss

s

x

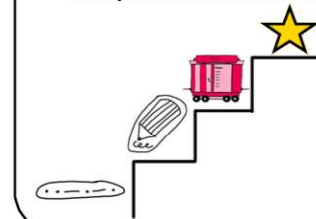
z

...then add 'es'

This is the tricky bit!



Steps to success



LO: To know how to change nouns from singular to plural by adding s or es.

To change these words in to plurals, add 'es'.

one brush



two brushes



box → boxes

dish → dishes

glass → glasses

church → churches

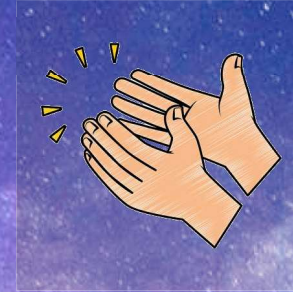

Steps to success



LO: To know how to change nouns from singular to plural by adding s or es.

The way a word sounds is a clue
whether you need to add 's' or 'es'.
We can do a clapping test!
Let's try with these words.



cat

bench

dish

boot

fox

brush

star



LO: To know how to change nouns from singular to plural by adding s or es.

Lets play a game!

Shuffle your word cards and deal them into two piles. Ask a grown up to hide the words from one pile around the room - no peeking!

Read each word and decide whether it is a singular noun or a plural noun.

See if you can find the singular/plural equivalent from the words hidden around the room to make matching singular/plural pairs.

Does the plural have 's' or 'es' at the end?
