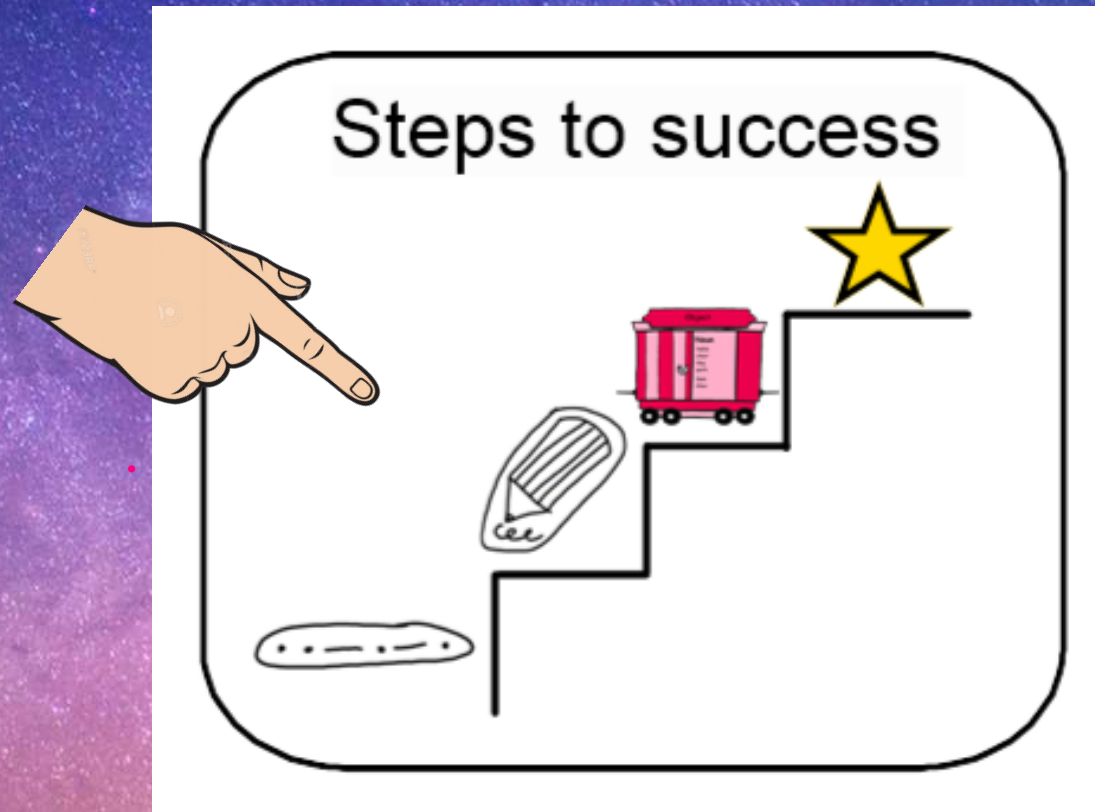

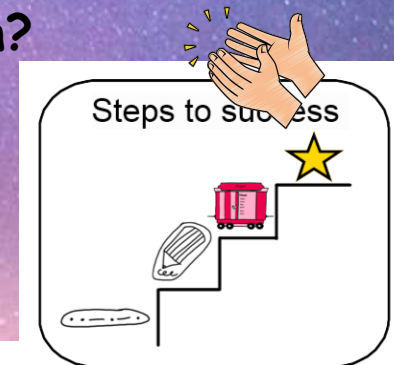

A little reminder...

Singular = 1		Plural = more than 1	
	One dog	→	Lots of dogs 
	One door	→	Lots of doors 
	One pencil	→	Lots of pencils 
	One lamp	→	Lots of lamps 



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To change these words in to plurals, add 'es'.

one brush



two brushes



box → boxes

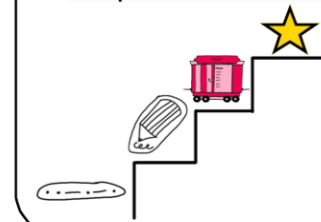
dish → dishes

glass → glasses

church → churches

Remember, do the clapping test!
If it adds an extra syllable to the end of the word, add es.

Steps to success



LO: To know how to change nouns from singular to plural by adding s or es.

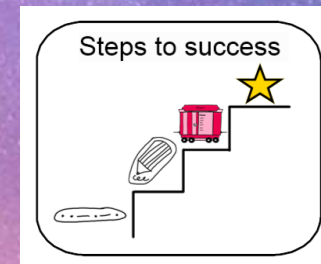
Your task today is to work out the matching singular/plural noun and write it in the table.
